## **Course Overview:**

Ceramics will assist students in developing knowledge and understanding of basic handbuilding and wheel-throwing techniques that will enable them to create pottery with function and meaning. Hand-building techniques will include pinch, coil, and slab, as well as various additive and subtractive sculptural methods. Students will demonstrate different glazing techniques to achieve desired aesthetic appearance, as well as to express their creativity. Frequent class critiques will be conducted.

## THE SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES FOR THE CLASS ARE:

- Know the three ceramic handbuilding techniques: Pinch, coil, slab & how to construct something combining these techniques.
- Know how to use different types of clay.
- Know how to use the glazes using the pour and dip technique, using slip glazing as well as the staining technique.
- Know how to use the wheel from set up, centering, shaping and trimming to clean up and how to make a set of pots.
- Know ceramic terms and vocabulary that are pertinent to the ceramics works and workings of the ceramics studio.
- Know their way around the ceramics studio independently.

Clean up time will be the final ten minutes of class. Do a thorough job of washing brushes, wiping tables/counters, and PUTTING MATERIALS AWAY properly. Be sure to wipe the tables and tops of glue bottles and twist shut, etc. Wipe the rims and close any paint jars or bottles tightly. Put the lids on the clay containers and glazes. A little help from everybody will make things easier for all of us. Use time wisely. If your project is extra messy, you may need to allow 15 minutes for cleanup.

Once you have cleaned up, please sit in your seat until the bell rings so it will be easier for those still cleaning up to navigate throughout the classroom.

USE OF TECHNOLOGY:
We will enforce the school policy regarding the use of technology (computers, cell phones, MP3 players, iPads, etc.). I will allow MP3 players during studio time, on occasion, if students ask prior to listening to them.

iPads are a tool we will use on occasion in class. They are issued to you to aid your educational experience, similar to a textbook. Use them when asked, otherwise, don't allow them to be a distraction.

IF PRINTING: Do not print from the Internet without your instructor's permission. If possible, print on both sides of your paper to conserve paper. Only print once. Do not repeatedly send documents to the printer. Print in black & white unless you have your instructor's permission to print in color.
